As we head towards the end of term, we start to feel weary and mornings seem to get earlier. Please remember that whenever students arrive at school after 8am, their attendance needs to be recorded at the School Office so that there is an accurate record of who is on site. In this case students will be issued a late pass to take to the classroom. As classes are busy first thing in the morning parents are asked not to accompany students into the classroom or try to talk to teachers at this time since this interrupts learning for all students. If you wish to meet with your child's teacher, please arrange a mutually convenient time.

In the afternoon, please remember that school finishes at 2:30pm. To facilitate collection of siblings from more than one classroom, students can remain in their classrooms until 2:50pm. After this time they are taken to the office to wait. At 3:10pm, a phone call will be made to parents for any students not yet picked up. From this time onwards a charge may be made for late supervision. If you are running late for any reason, please communicate this to the school so that we are aware of the delay and we can in turn advise your children that you are on your way. We do appreciate the support of parents in prompt drop-off and pick-up.
