### News from Music Department

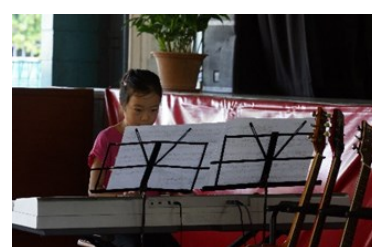
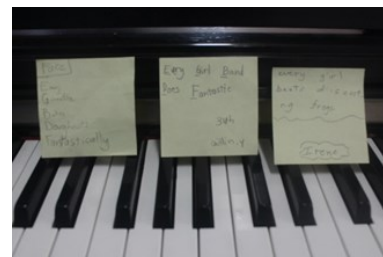
The Prep classes have been exploring high and low pitch and how different instruments produce different pitches, as well as exploring animal and environmental sounds. The Grade Ones and Grade Twos took this idea another level higher and explored how pitch gets higher and lower on the guitar and violin. They learnt how to identify C, D and E notes on the treble clef and learnt to play three note melodies on the keyboard.

Grade Three and Four students created phrases to help read notes on the treble clef and played melodic passages on the guitar and violin following written music notes. Did you know "Every Giraffe Bakes Doughnuts Fantastically"? Or that "Every Girl Beats Disgusting Frogs"?

Grade Five and Six used tones and semitones to identify a major scale formula and used this to identify major scales in different keys.

Grade Seven and Eight students learnt to play basslines, chords and triads of the Rock N Roll genre and studied some history on Elvis Presley.

The TEMIS School choir have been privileged to practice with one of PNG's famous singers Santania and the NCD youth choir from Hohola and Hanuabada for the Digicel man of Honor Awards night on Saturday. The Man of Honor choir including our students will be performing at the School Hall during the performance assembly this Friday.
